THE PANTRY REPORT

During the month of October, 399 food requests were made, and 1,026 people were fed--an increase of 6% from October 2018. Enough food was provided for 18,468 meals.

In November, there were 400 food requests made for 1,131 people--a 29% increase from November 2018. 20,358 meals were provided.

THE CLOSET REPORT

In October, 429 people were clothed (261 adults and 168 children) for a total of 1,207 outfits. This was a 27% decrease from 2018.

In November, 456 people (263 adults and 193 children) were clothed with 1,217 outfits. This was an 23% increase from last year.
