THE PANTRY REPORT

During the month of April, 308 food requests were made, and 793 people were fed--an increase of 4% from April 2018. Enough food was provided for 14,274 meals.

In May, there were 328 food requests made for 829 people--a 9% decrease from May 2018. 14,922 meals were provided.

In April, 174 people were clothed (106 adults and 68 children) for a total of 451 outfits. This was a 24% decrease from 2018. In April, a total of 43 households got housewares.

In May, 334 people (192 adults and 142 children) were clothed with 1,049 outfits. This was a 7% decrease from last year. Also in May, 51 households got housewares.
