In November, there were 332 food requests made for 977 people--a 6% decrease from November 2017. 15,786 meals were provided.

The Closet Report

In October, 337 people were clothed (212 adults and 125 children) for a total of 928 outfits. This was a 15% decrease from 2017. In October, a total of 49 households got housewares.

In November, 372 people (205 adults and 167 children) were clothed with 1,016 outfits. This was a 3% decrease from last year. Also in November, 48 households got housewares.
