## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### Fellow FISH Volunteers:

This month's newsletter is packed, so my comments will be limited to three issues that deserve emphasis.

First, as promised when we resumed the masking requirement last month for both volunteers and clients, the Board of Directors carefully re-considered the masking decision on June 16, and decided to continue the practice for at least another month. I ask for your cooperation so that we can all remain safe.

Second, we've been challenged with inter-team communications for as long as I can remember. Significant things that happen on a Monday, for example, aren't always passed along to teams that follow. To remedy this, we have started a daily log for each team to record significant events as they occur. This will provide a ready reference for the FISH staff and coordinators and assist in the more efficient conduct of our operations. If nothing significant happens on your shift, simply state that.

Finally, I'm pleased to report that after a lengthy period of due diligence, on Monday, June 20, the Williamsburg Area Transportation Authority (WATA) will begin bus service to FISH. During this trial, WATA buses will stop at a temporary bus stop adjacent to 312 Second Street at 10:41 AM, 12:41 PM and 2:41 PM.
