THE PANTRY REPORT

During the month of August, 340 food requests were made, and 809 people were fed--a decrease of 2% from August 2018. Enough food was provided for 16,020 meals. In September, there were 309 food requests made for 796 people--a 17% decrease from September 2018. 14,328 meals were provided.

THE CLOSET REPORT

In August, 252 people were clothed (163 adults and 89 children) for a total of 726 outfits. This was a 25% decrease from 2018. In August, a total of 59 households got housewares.

In September, 203 people (122 adults and 81 children) were clothed with 726 outfits. This was an 14% decrease from last year. Also in September, 43 households got housewares.
