During the month of August, there were 340 requests for 840 recipients for a total of 12,600 meals. Persons fed was up 5% from August 2015.

In September there were 366 requests for 910 recipients for a total of 13,650 meals. Persons fed was up 6% from September, 2015.

The Closet Report:



In August, 899 outfits were provided to 173 adults and 135 children. Housewares were provided to 45 households in August. In August the total number of requests was up 4% from August, 2015. In September 743 outfits were provided to 148 adults and 111 children. Housewares were provided to 44 households in September. The total number of requests in September was up 2% from September 2015.
