The Pantry Report:

During the month of August, there were 365 requests for 926 recipients for a total of 16,668 meals. Persons fed was down 13% from August 2016. In September there were 332 requests for 839 recipients for a total of 15,102 meals. Persons fed was down 8% from September, 2016.

The Closet Report: In August, 809 outfits were provided to 161 adults and 129 children. Housewares were provided to 48 households in August. In August the total number of requests was down 2% from August, 2016. In September, outfits were provided to 137 adults and 95 children. Housewares were provided to 40 households in September. The total number of requests in September was down 10% from September 2016.
