Greetings,

After several months of closure,

the board has decided to attempt a reopening of FISH. Many hours of discussion and planning have gone into this difficult decision. The safety of our volunteers has always been our main concern.

We will be opening on September 9, at 12:00 for food only. Our hours will be 12:00-4:00 on Wednesdays and Fridays. Food bags will be prepared ahead of time to allow two person teams to handle the shifts. The same safety protocols will be in place for a contactless food pickup. It is critical that all volunteers follow the safety precautions spelled out by Martha Buell. This includes not reporting in if you don't feel well.

Food donations will be accepted on Thursdays at the clothing donation doorway. This will also be contactless. Food will then be set aside for a period of time before it is packed and distributed.

During our closure, we have contributed over \$30,000 in food to other nonprofits to feed those in need.

It is our hope to be able to deal with clothing in the near future. Face to face contact is not an option the board is willing to explore at this time.

Your board has met by Zoom and in person during this time, and I would like to thank them for their efforts.

Let us hope that this is the beginning of getting back to normal.
