This year more regular FISH volunteers worked on campus than ever before.

In addition to these "regulars", let's spotlight a few new and special projects:

- Austin Moschler, owner of <u>VA Moving</u>, provided a truck and 2 movers for the 3rd year. Will Bennett and son Andrew recruited Boy Scout Troop 102 for heavy duty breakdown and unloading at FISH after the event.
- Talented graphic artist Jenny Davy designed a flyer for publicity.
- Our campus sponsor, Catholic Campus Ministry, secured the space and paid for parking, campus publicity and Square Reader fees.
- Service fraternity Alpha Phi Omega recruited over 30 volunteers.
- The Monday Closet Team boosted 50/50 Raffle ticket sales by challenging others to equal or surpass their purchases. How exciting that the winning ticket belonged to a FISH volunteer! But not from the Monday Team...
